Resolution 23-110

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF BOONTON, COUNTY OF MORRIS AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY APPROVING CONTINUED DISCUSSIONS WITH RIVERWALK LLC AS TO A POSSIBLE PILOT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Town of Boonton (hereinafter also “the Town”) has been discussing the proposals made by Riverwalk LLC, and

WHEREAS, representatives of Riverwalk LLC have appeared at Town meetings to present their proposals and answered questions about the project; and

WHEREAS, while financing of the project has yet to formally discussed and/or negotiated, the Town has a long history of utilizing available programs, like PILOT programs, otherwise known as N.J.S.A § 40A:20-1., et seq., and known as the “Long Term Tax Exemption Law” to allow projects within the Town that might otherwise not be viable for various reasons; and

WHEREAS, while negotiations have not yet occurred, and further details will be necessary, the Town wishes to continue discussions as to a possible PILOT program with Riverwalk LLC.

1. The Town of Boonton hereby shall continue discussions as to a possible PILOT with Riverwalk LLC, and any other necessary parties to that discussion as may be required, subject to any additional detail and any eventual negotiation, as noted herein.

ORDINANCE 02-23 (Public Hearing/Adoption)
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PART II, GENERAL LEGISLATION, ARTICLE II, GARAGE SALES, CHAPTER 225-14, EXCEPTIONS, WITHIN THE TOWN CODE OF THE TOWN OF BOONTON

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Boonton wish to update the Town Code of the Town of Boonton to as to exemptions provisions for religious and non-profit organizations as to garage sales within the Town of Boonton; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Boonton wish to exempt such organizations from paying any associated fee pursuant to such sales.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF BOONTON, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE.

Part II, General Legislation, Article II, Garage Sales, Chapter 225-14, Exceptions, is herein repealed and replaced with the following language:

225-14 Exceptions.

The provisions of this article shall not apply to or affect the following persons or sales:

1. Persons selling goods pursuant to an order or process of a court of competent jurisdiction.
2. Religious and/or non-profit organizations shall be exempt as to any fees referenced pursuant to Section 225-10 and Section 130-19, but must still file an application and receive a garage sale license prior to any garage sale, "flea market." other any other such casual sales event.

SECTION TWO. All Ordinances of the Town of Boonton which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION THREE. If any section, subsection, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION FOUR. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

SECTION FIVE. This Ordinance may be renumbered for purposes of codification.
