Free to members, there is a \$5.00 suggested donation for non-members.

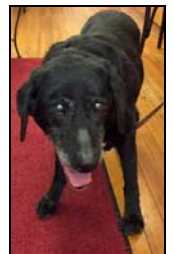

**Sabers, Swords, Guns, And Glory:
 Militaria In Morris County**

Experience rarely seen weaponry from Morris County Historical Society's extensive militaria collection. The exhibit spans more than two centuries of American military history and features a Revolutionary War saber, 1862 Springfield rifle, 19th-century Kentucky long rifle, Civil War munitions and accoutrements, military uniforms from the 20th century, and numerous medals and commendations earned by local soldiers and veterans.

Wednesdays and Thursdays 11 AM to 4 PM, Sundays 1 to 4 PM.
